Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider evaluates the quality of the provision. They explain the improvements that have been made since the last inspection. The provider discusses how they capture the views of children, staff and parents when planning future provision, including the rules and expectations of the club.
- The provider explains the policies and procedures they have in place for the effective operation of the provision. For instance, they describe procedures for the meeting the new requirements around safer eating, dealing with children's accidents and the fire evacuation.
- The provider has a positive attitude to providing an inclusive service, where all children are welcome. They understand how to adapt the service to ensure that all children will benefit from the opportunities available. They explain the systems in place for working in partnership with parents and the host school to ensure that they can meet the needs of all children that attend the provision effectively.
- Through a tour of the premises, the provider demonstrates a secure understanding of risk assessment. For example, they describe how daily checks identify and remove any hazards prior to children attending.
- The provider recognises the importance of partnership working. They describe how club staff liaise with school leaders to gather information about children's care and education. The provider explains how they will use the information gathered to complement children's learning, monitor attendance and keep children safe.
- The provider describes how they will promote children's positive behaviour. For instance, they understand how important it is to agree clear, age-appropriate rules and boundaries for all children and remind children of this regularly. The provider explains that staff all staff receive training on how to support children's positive behaviour as part of their induction and there has been a renewed focus on this since the last inspection.
- The provider explains the support they offer the staff team. They describe how they hold regular catch-up meetings with new staff during their induction and probation period to check their knowledge and understanding of the provider's policies and procedures. The provider values the importance of ensuring that club leaders and staff access the suite of training available to help to improve staff skills and knowledge.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- Older children spoke to the inspector about what they enjoy doing at the club.
- The inspector held discussions with the provider during the inspection to determine their understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector reviewed documentation, including the suitability of staff working at the club.
- The inspector viewed the provision and discussed the safety and suitability of the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
